HABITAT AND ECOLOGY

Found over sandy and muddy substrates in coastal waters and estuaries. Feeds on fish, crustaceans and mollusks. Spawning season between August and September.

DISTRIBUTION

Mediterranean record: several individuals were recorded from Israel (Golani and Mires, 2000; Golani et al., 2015) and from Licata, Sicily in 2016 (Langenek et al., 2017). All these records are likely escapees from aquaculture farms.

Original distribution: West Atlantic from New York to Florida and Mexico.

HABITAT AND ECOLOGY

Inhabits shallow coastal waters usually rich with vegetation to depth of 70 m. Feeds probably on large invertebrates. Young specimens often observed associated with drifting algae; they also swim in close proximity to artificial objects in the water.

DISTRIBUTION

Mediterranean record: two records only, from Karaada Island, Turkey in 2006 (Bilecenoglu and Kaya, 2006) and from Ashdod, Israel in 2010 (Golani *et al.*, 2011).

Original distribution: Wide Indo-west Pacific distribution from the Red Sea and South Africa to Australia and Palau.
